



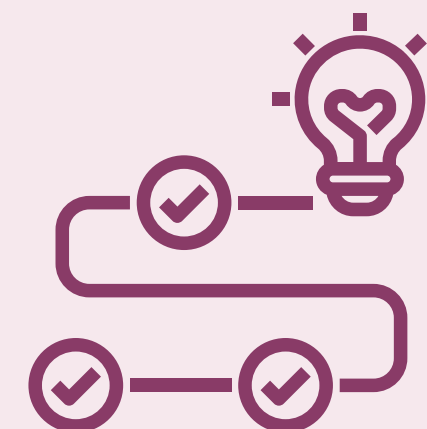
KEY FINDINGS

- **Study Objective:** Assess if adult psoriasis severity criteria (Rule of Tens [R10], and IPC Consensus Statement [IPCcs]) apply to pediatric patients.
- **Cohort:** 641 pediatric psoriasis patients from the Child-CAPTURE registry.



RESULTS

- **R10 Criteria:** 49.0% met severe psoriasis threshold (PASI >10, BSA >10%, or CDLQI >10).
- **IPCcs Criteria:** 92.4% were candidates for systemic therapy due to high-impact site involvement (90.6%), especially the scalp (84.1%).
- **Quality of Life:** Impaired HRQoL (CDLQI >10) associated with:
 - High-impact site involvement (OR 1.9)
 - BSA >10% (OR 1.8)
 - Teen age (13-17 years) (OR 1.8)



CONCLUSION

- IPC's Consensus Statement identifies more pediatric candidates for systemic therapy than R10 due to high prevalence of high-impact site involvement.
- Strong link between high-impact site involvement and impaired HRQoL highlights the need for additional pediatric-specific qualification criteria for systemic therapy.
